I express my heartfelt gratitude to my team and volunteers, for their support and perseverance, who worked rigorously towards the cause related to human rights for Hindus in the pandemic.

This isn't merely some token exercise but an important gesture to the stranded and nearly forsaken Hindu people who are otherwise not finding sufficient support to learn about and access their own cultural values, necessary support for thriving as people and regain rightful place within the larger Hindu community on Earth.

To that extent, I'm very thankful to the team of Hindu Rights Watch for noticing this major gap in cultural unity of Hindus and also reaching out to the most vulnerable groups in frontier areas where the battle of civilizations is being played out by sinister groups for a long time.

# Delhi Riots Relief Project

In Delhi Riots, **53 people**, including a policeman and an IB personnel, lost their lives, while hundreds were injured, and shops and houses were burnt or destroyed. ***It all started in December 2019 from Jamia Nagar in which public property was vandalized, government buses were burnt, Police patrolling vehicles were set on fire and bus drivers were beaten up by Muslims rioters.***



In **Feb 2021**, the mob of Muslim rioters slowly moved toward North East Delhi and strategically targeted the Hindu & Sikh communities. As a result, the places such as Bhajanpura, Gokulpuri, Karawal Nagar were vandalized based on religion. ***Shops, vehicles, homes and schools owned by Hindus were set ablaze. These areas were majorly populated by Hindus belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.***

**Hindu families, women, and children faced the highest brunt.** The riot left them completely clueless, homeless, hopeless, extremely traumatized, and insecure. Because their houses were burnt, women were homeless and developed a sense of insecurity. Suddenly they realized that they were on the streets while **their husband, brother, or father were either dead or terribly injured.** That sense of fear and unsafe surroundings created **Posttraumatic stress disorder** among many of them. Children faced starvation, many had to drop out of schools as the families faced financial constraints or the schools were burnt.



**Hindu Rights Watch (HRW) team has identified such women and children with much effort by being on the riot spot, day in and day out among the victims.**

As a result, **293 such women and children were identified and supported** to sustain their basic living by providing them food, clothing, school fees, books, sanitation kits, medication kits, dry ration kits, and many more essential commodities required for survival.

**256 Hindu females,** facing homelessness and financial helplessness post-riot situation, were provided sanitation kits.



Delhi riots also witnessed the **poor daily wage laborers devastated and starving on footpaths** as they had no means of living after losing everything they brought from their hometown, being migrants from the nearby states like UP, Bihar, Haryana, Punjab, etc. **Hindu Rights Watch** organized a facility where **13 daily wage laborers were provided financial help** for their survival amidst the riot crisis.

Since many lost their **houses** as those were completely burnt, all their **ID proofs** and essential **documents** were also lost in the riots. We all are aware of the importance of such documents in our lives.

Therefore, our team conducted surveys, and **142 families were identified and assisted to file FIR** at a police station about their loss because of the riot and we became a bridge between government offices and victims to procure the **duplicate copy of their documents** from the government offices such as **Aadhar card, PAN card, Bank account, ration card, daily labor card**, etc.



With the help of those documents, the victims were assisted in claiming **compensation** from the government.

The saddest part of such **riots is that it breaks the backbone** of any growing community. Along with the loss of lives, financial loss is seen as the greatest loss. Money can buy everything except love but love alone can not run a family. To run a healthy family, you need money, without which everything seems to collapse. A similar case was observed post the riot. **People felt financially choked** which led to survival issues.

HRW extended direct financial support to **33 families** as they faced problems paying for their **house rent, school fees, baby food and clothing, and other basic amenities**.

Our team also identified **7 Auto drivers** and **13 Shopkeepers**, and supported them financially after which they could restart their business at some level to earn their living and support their family.



Due to the riots, there was a high rise in casualties and an immediate requirement for **first aid**. Hence **95 medical kits** were distributed among families affected by the riots.



Our team also conducted **8 Camps** to support Delhi riots Hindu victims and we **trained 27 youth** for our relief work.

Other activities:



- **2480 copies of Shrimad Bhagavad Gita** were distributed among people during the pandemic to create positive mental well-being and sustain faith among people.



- **412 dry ration kits** were distributed among riot-affected people and people affected due to the pandemic.
- **372 food packets** were provided to laborers facing exodus during the pandemic.

# Bengal violence relief project

**West Bengal** witnessed political and **communal violence post-Vidhan Sabha elections in 2021**. In violence, the houses of Hindus were attacked by bombs, and their shops were set ablaze. Hindu women were raped. **Hindu men and young boys** were **killed**. **Hindu Children** were **beaten** up brutally.

According to the civil society group, out of **15000 violent incidents in Bengal, 7000 were cases of violence against women**. Hindu families were compelled to leave their homes and take refuge in nearby states such as Assam to **save their lives**.

In **May 2021**, Hindu Rights Watch started its relief project in West Bengal. It launched its team of **20 social workers** and started working in different areas of West Bengal such as **Malda, Kolkata and 24 Parganas**.



However after **2 months** due to scarcity of funds, the team had to downsize. But this did not shake the determination and spirit of Hindu Rights Watch team. With the help of **2 local NGOs and a team of 4 Hindu Rights Watch members**, Hindu Rights Watch relief activities and services continued for the next **5 months** in the violence-affected areas and victims.

**929 Hindu women and children** were provided help during Bengal violence by Hindu Rights Watch. **45 Hindu families** were provided financial support. 808 **Sanitary kits** and diapers were provided to women and children. **Milk packets for children**, ORS packets, Vitamin tablets, Glucose packets, undergarments etc. were distributed among Hindu families.

**396 medical kits, 500 dry ration kits, 380 food packets, 213 clothes** were distributed. **101 Daily wage laborers** were provided with **5 kg** dry ration each, during this crisis.



**27 sewing machines** were provided to women to facilitate stitching of masks, bed sheets and clothes, and the same were distributed among the victims.



**11 Advocacy Camps** were organized by Hindu Rights Watch team to support the victims based on their social, economical and religious issues.



Victims were provided **881 tents and mosquito nets** to live in because it was the same time when Bengal was hit by Cyclone and homeless victims were falling ill due to living in wet environments.



Amidst this, **3530 Shrimad Bhagwad Gita** was also distributed to strengthen the community value and faith of the Hindu families that the Truth shall prevail.

Violence-affected Hindu families were facilitated in receiving compensation from the government for being riot-affected victims, by enrolling their names and documenting in government offices. Overall, **424 victims were helped in getting their names documented as victims of the violence.**

Rishi Valmiki Program is a program of Hindu Rights Watch which is designed to promote **unity and equality within the Hindu community**. Through this program with the help of the ancient history of the Varna system, we try to bring into light about the original practices and their significance and also explain how it has been misinterpreted in today's era. Hence through various tools and ways of community development, we **mobilize the community and organize sessions about the same objective**.

# Gita Program

**Religious conversion** is a grave issue in India. Rural India and urban slums are majorly affected by the ill effects of religious conversion.

Poor people are targeted and compelled to convert in exchange for **monetary benefits, academic support, medical support** etc. Poor Hindu people are brainwashed in the name of religion and given wrong information about Hindu religious rituals and practices.

Therefore as a part of our **Hindu Rights Watch program known as the Gita Program, we distribute Shrimad Bhagwat Gita among Hindu people and families so that they get to read and understand our holy Hindu books by themselves and verify.**

Through this program every month, our team encourages the formation of a **small group** of like-minded people in **different villages as support groups.**

# Arjuna Program

Arjuna Program is a **capacity-building** program based on the areas of interest through **workshops and community-based activities for youth** living in the **villages or urban slum** areas. This program is designed to engage the potential Hindu young minds (girls and boys) in community development to preserve the **sanctity, culture and traditional practices, and belief system of the Hindu community.**



Through this program, we aim to create Arjunas within Hindu community to protect and be the change agents in **nation-building (Akhand Bharat)**. It is essential and is our primary responsibility to engage them and accommodate their ideas to ensure the constant development of our society. As a result, **Arjuna Program is launched to identify and shape up our Arjunas within our society.**

## From 1 Jan 2020 to 30 Oct 2021 under the Arjuna Program following activities were conducted:

We trained **278 youth** who were then engaged in the following activities:

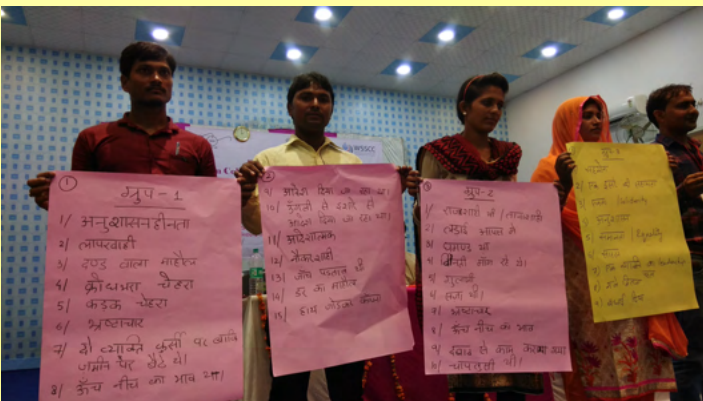
**1. Anti - Human trafficking and Anti - Women & Child abuse activities:** According to data collected, the maximum number of children who went missing were from the three districts i.e. Hazaribagh, Dhanbad, and Singhbhum of the state.



- **Hazaribagh: 27 children** have gone missing, including **17 girls and 10 boys.**

- **Dhanbad: 23 children** went missing, including **19 girls and four boys.**

- **East Singhbhum: 21 children** missing, including **19 girls and two boys.**



**Our team has rescued 5 Hindu tribal girls (underage, less than 15 years) and 3 adult girls.**

**2. Anti conversion activities:** The Covid 19 pandemic is also a **financial crisis**. This broke the backbone of the society as it led to an existential crisis. When an existential crisis hits any society it leads to several forms of compromises as the **exploiters target the vulnerable group** in exchange for money. The same is the **case of religion-based conversion.**

Some Hindu tribal people objected and protested against the religious conversion propaganda of **Christian Church Pastors**. Police arrested more than 100 Hindu people & registered FIRs against 4 Hindu people. **The 4 Hindu boys from the Jharia area of Jharkhand were provided legal support by Hindu Rights Watch team in July 2020.**

**3. Relief work at Delhi riot-affected areas:** From March 2020 to Oct 2020, Hindu Rights Watch team also conducted **8 Camps** to support Delhi riots Hindu victims in **Bhajanpura, Gokulpuri and Karawal Nagar**. We trained **27 youth** for our relief work.



**4. Relief work in Bengal violence-affected areas:** In the Arjuna program, **11 Advocacy Camps** were organized by Hindu Rights Watch team to support the **Bengal violence Hindu victims** based on their social, economical, and religious issues from May 2021 to Sep 2021. For this relief work, **24 youths** were trained.

# Durga Program

The **Durga program** is one of the programs running very successfully within the community towards **women empowerment of Hindu families**. During these workshops, various topics are covered about issues related to **Hindu women's rights, violence against Hindu women, child marriages, Hindu girls trafficking, acid attacks, growing cases of rape and molestation** in rural India, and provide awareness and ways to fight against these crimes.

***During Covid 19 crisis, Missionaries had been running fake medical camps with untrained and unprofessional pastors. They did not have authorized doctors in their camps. Religious pastors instead of medical officers were giving medicine to tribal people. Therefore to save the lives of tribal people from such fake and non-medical pastors, we started our sanitation awareness project in Jharkhand.***

It was also observed that the missionaries were actively using government resources in their projects. **As a result, we launched our livelihood program in the rural areas of Jharkhand.**



Under the Durga program, Hindu Rights Watch provided sewing machines & financial support to **3 families to start their small-scale business in Vishnugarh block, Jharkhand**. Now 3 families are producing approximately 3000 masks in a week. Till Oct 2021 we have donated **17 sewing machines** and provided a **seed fund to labour families** to start their small-scale business. We are glad that male members of those families are also supportive. Women sew clothes and male members of families iron & sell them.

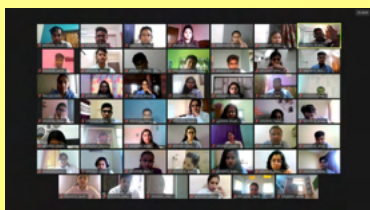
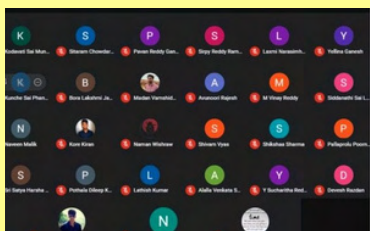
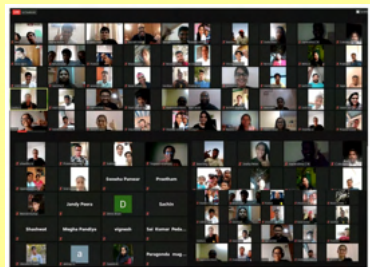
**One tribal girl** shared, her family is also facing financial problems. She knew sewing but she did not have a machine. **One missionary guy** had offered her a sewing machine if only **she got converted to Christianity**.



After knowing this incident, Hindu Rights watch **donated 2 sewing machines to 2 tribal girls in the Ramgarh district** of Jharkhand. By using these sewing machines, these 2 young girls are preparing face masks and supplying them in general stores & medical stores, and are helping their families financially.

Hindu Rights Watch also provided **27 sewing machines & financial support to 27 Females** to start their livelihood in **political & communal violence-affected North 24 Parganas, Bengal**.

Our team also **rescued 5 Jharkhandi Hindu tribal girls** (underage, less than 15 years) and **3 girls** are adults.



In **May 2020**, Hindu Rights Watch held a **video conference** discussing the emerging issue of **women and child trafficking** in rural areas of Jharkhand. It was discussed in the conference that people from **non-Hindu communities** build a relationship with **Hindu females**. Later they **trap women** and **sell them to tier 1 cities of Delhi, Haryana and West Bengal** in the name of **lucrative job opportunities, and love**.

In **June 2020**, 2 **video conferences** were held on **"Rise in sexual abuse cases of Hindu girls in Jharkhand"** and 2 Video conferences on **"sexual abuse cases against Hindu females**.

In **July 2020**, Hindu Rights Watch team was working on **Human trafficking** issues. Our team has organized 4 conferences on **"Hindu Female trafficking & Child sexual abuse in Jharkhand"**. Our team of HRW had also conducted 2 online conferences & reporting meetings on **"Female trafficking in Jharkhand & child abuse"**.

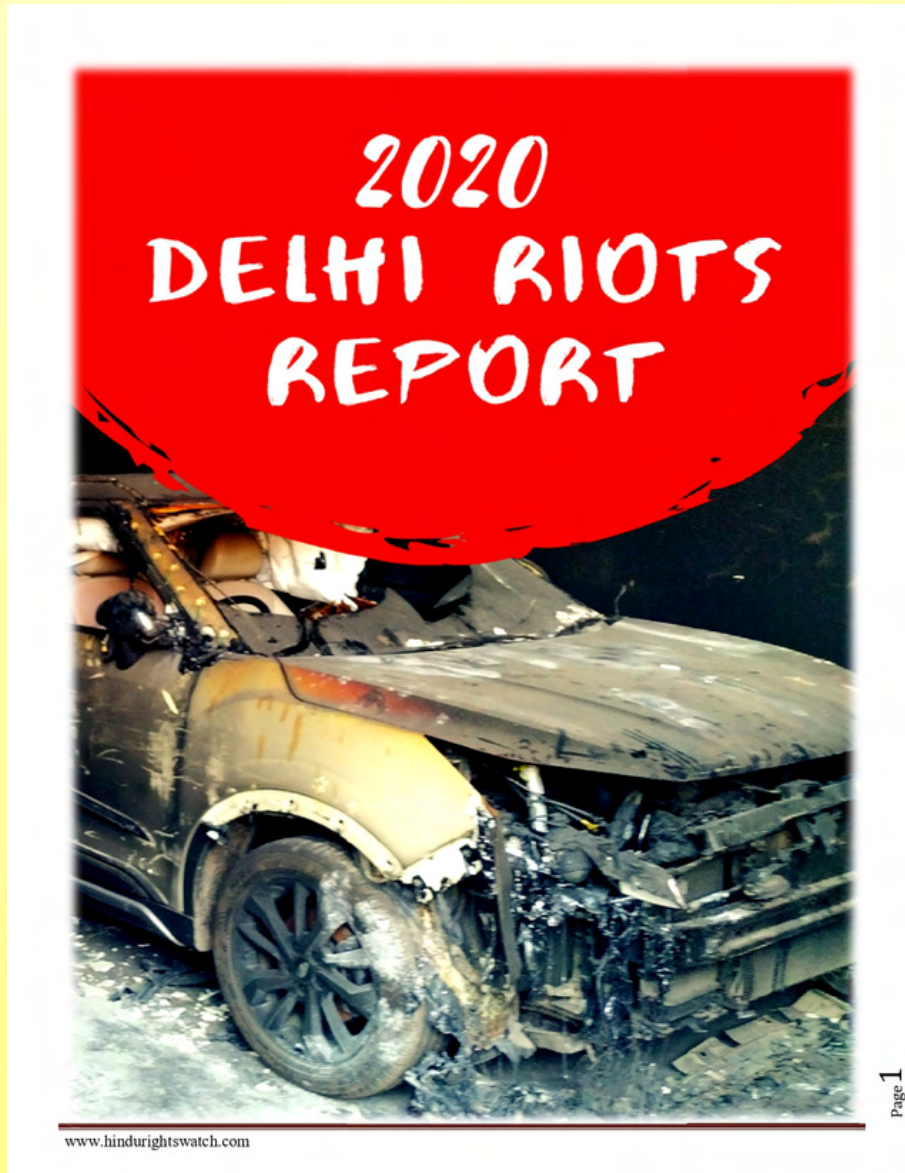
